

Riley Temple '71, earned his JD degree from Georgetown in 1974, and in 2014 a Masters degree in Theological Studies, *cum laude*, from the Virginia Theological Seminary. He retired two years ago from over 40 years practicing telecommunications law. Elected to Lafayette's Board of Trustees in 1994, he served as its Secretary and its Vice Chair, making him the first, and to date, the only openly gay Trustee and Board Officer. He was elected to *emeritus* status in 2008, and in 2009, Lafayette conferred upon him a Doctor of Laws degree, *Honoris Causa*.

He endowed the David L. and Helen J. Temple Visiting Lecture Series in Africana Studies, and a Study Abroad Scholarship. During the 1980s he chaired the Board of Washington's Whitman-Walker Clinic, the nation's highly regarded and awarded care organization for persons with HIV/AIDS. He has served on the Board of the Human Rights Campaign, America's largest and most influential LGBTQ lobbying organization. Finally, he is the author of *Aunt Ester's Children Redeemed: Journeys to Freedom in August Wilson's Ten Plays of Twentieth-Century Black America* (Cascade, 2017). He currently preaches regularly, lectures, pens essays, and teaches the theology of secular literature at the Virginia Theological and Wesley Seminaries.
